We used BankMobile exclusively except in rare instances where the College issued a check directly, such as when the student was under age 17 or the or the student's name was too long to transmit to BankMobile. Additionally, from the HEERF III authorization, all students receiving emergency financial aid were offered the option to apply their aid to their outstanding balance.
